



Thursday Sessions

Thursday 10:00AM-12:00PM

Patient Engagement

Who: Patients and Patient Engagement Officers

What: This session will discuss the role of patients, caregivers and coordinators in the work of the GPC. We will talk about different types of research and what kinds of research can best use the resources of the GPC to improve patient care and health.

Institutional Review Board (IRB) Meeting

Who: IRB members

What: This session will work on the progress of sharing common reviews of projects to make sure patients and their health data are properly protected and that research is conducted in ethical ways.

Discussion of Trials/Studies

Who: Site PIs

What: There are already a number of research studies being conducted across the GPC, and to make sure that all of the sites understand their responsibilities and have the opportunity to discuss institutional problems, the lead person from each site (called the Principal Investigator) will meet.

Fishing Trip

Who: Medical Informatics teams, others who are interested

What: We call this a fishing trip because we are going to show everyone how they can “fish” for necessary information that is needed to answer their research questions. Tamara McMahon is going to demonstrate how the system works at KUMC.

Cohort Characterization

Who: Cohort groups

What: A cohort is a name for a group of patients who share a common set of conditions and are part of a research study. In GPC 1.0, we focused on breast cancer, ALS (Lou Gehrig’s disease) and healthy weight in children. If you were involved in GPC 1.0 in one of these groups are interested in hearing an update on surveys, patient engagement activities, etc., join in!

Patient Engagement

Who: Patients and Patient Engagement Officers

What: We will start this session with hearing about patient engagement from two patient advocates at Children's Mercy Hospital, followed by comments from PPRN participants. Having their input will kick off our session to focus on 1) how to help describe the GPC in ways that will help get patients interested at the local level, and 2) how can we make sure patient perspectives are at every "table" in the GPC. If we can, we will also write a value statement together.

Who: DROC members, Honest Brokers, Patients

What: We want to make sure that we think of everyone’s perspectives when we review projects. This session will discuss how we can ensure this happens.

Project Management Meeting

Who: Project Managers

What: This will be a live version of the Project Management Call which normally occurs every other Friday morning by phone.
